

Believer's - Try not to use the generic term 'God'

Many Believer's today are beginning to realize that from the very beginning there has been a truly demonic effort to remove **The Almighty Father's name** from the Bible.

Removing The Almighty Father's name from both the sight and sound of mankind has been the purpose and goal Satan's plan from the beginning.

Today, the Scriptural name '**Yahweh**' has been **replaced** with the unscriptural terms '**God**' and '**Lord**', by the vast majority of Pastors, Christian authors and church goers.

The Origin of the English Word 'God'

You may be amazed to learn that the words 'God' and 'LORD' are **not Scriptural words**. The English word for 'God' has become a source of confusion for Christians since at least the Anglo-Saxon era. *Webster's New Collegiate Dictionary* says that the origin of the word 'god' comes from a Germanic word 'gad,' pronounced as "gohdt." 'God' - The word 'god' goes back via Germanic to Indo-European, in which a corresponding ancestor form meant "**invoked one.**" The word's only surviving non-Germanic relative is Sanskrit hu, **invoke the gods**, a form which appears in the Rig Veda, most ancient of Hindu scriptures: puru-hutas, "**much invoked,**" **epithet of the rain-and-thunder god Indra**. 'GOD' is the common Teutonic (Germanic) word for a personal object of religious worship, **applied to all the superhuman beings of the heathen mythologies, and various kinds of idols**. The word "god" on the conversion of the Teutonic (Germanic) races to Christianity was adopted as the name of the One Supreme Being, **but this is error. The correct personal proper name of the One Supreme Being is Yahweh.**

'*Encyclopedia of Religion and Ethics*' and '*Webster's Twentieth Century Dictionary*', **agree that the origin of the word God, is Teutonic paganism.**

The King James translators used a pagan Anglo-Saxon word "god" from the Germanic "gad." ***No one has ever really challenged the widespread use of this unscriptural word!***

The King James translators made another translation error regarding the name of the Almighty. **They changed the name “Yahweh”, to the Anglo-Saxon word, ‘LORD’.** According to ‘New Unger’s Bible Dictionary’, the word ‘LORD’, that we see in the Old Testament, **should have been translated as ‘Yahweh’.**

“Yahweh... This is used as a proper name of the Almighty and should have been retained in that form by the translators.” Translators have mistranslated the name of the Almighty, by calling Him, “LORD,” instead of “Yahweh”.

YAH YAHWEH YAHSHUA **Are names of The Almighty Father**

Some people say that ‘YAH’ is the shortened, or abbreviated form of the Almighty Father’s name, **but that is not correct.** ‘YAH’ **is** the name of the Almighty Father.

David tells us clearly in Psalm 68:4 that the Almighty Father’s name is ‘YAH’.

*Sing to God, sing praises to His name; Extol Him who rides on the clouds, By His name **YAH**, And rejoice before Him.*

The prophet Isaiah tells us the Almighty Father’s name is ‘YAH’ in Isaiah 12:2.

*Behold, God is my salvation, I will trust and not be afraid; ‘For **YAH**, the LORD, is my strength and song; He also has become my salvation.’*

In Revelation 19:1-6 the multitudes are shouting Hallelu-**YAH**, which means, “Praise **YAH**”.

YAH YAHWEH YAHSHUA
What do these names mean?

YAH - is The Almighty Father's name

YAH-weh - Is a compound name

Yahweh is the Almighty Father's name **YAH**, with a 'descriptor' added.
The descriptor '**weh**' means, 'The Self-Existent one' (I AM).

YAH-weh means, '**YAH** - The Self-Existent one'.

YAH-shua - Is a compound name

Yahshua is the Almighty Father's name **YAH**, with His highest descriptor added. In the New Testament, The Father now combines His name with His highest descriptor '**shua**', **which means, 'is salvation'**. **YAH-shua** means, '**YAH is Salvation**'.

YAH, waited to give us His highest name **Yahshua**, "***which is above every name***" until He came to us Himself as our **Savior** manifested in the flesh. (Philippians 2:9-11)
